### Assumptions on who can and can't access telehealth services

Dr Claire Brolan is a UQ Development Research Fellow at the Centre for Policy Futures at UQ. Claire is also an Affiliate Research Fellow at UQ's Queensland Centre for Intellectual and Developmental Disability. Claire is an interdisciplinary public health academic specialising in advancing equitable access to health services (including telehealth services) for disadvantaged population segments in practice, policy & law



The forum will explore the assumptions and myths about access to telehealth services by disadvantaged healthcare consumers. It is easy to make assumptions about who is unable or unwilling to engage in telehealth supports. This forum examines the 'most appropriate' way to provide health services to marginalised or disempowered groups for improved equitable access to healthcare. Queensland's new right to access health services law (section 37, Human Rights Act 2019 (Qld)) will frame this forum's discussion.
